SALES, RELOCATIONS, MERGERS K-Tec, a designer and manufacturer of material handling equipment, has moved into a new 100,000-square-foot facility on Rockefeller Road in Wickliffe. Sequoia Realty Corp. has brokered the sale of Mentor's Points East Shopping Center at Ohio 20 and 306. Tenants include Old Navy, Panera Bread Co., Marc's and Marshalls. Lincoln Electric Co. has acquired Metrode Products Ltd., a private British company that makes alloy welding wires and electrodes. Metrode's annual sales are about \$24 million. WLS Stamping Co., a metal stamper and fabricator in Cleveland, is spending \$3.2 million to expand its operations to a building in Highland Heights. The company plans to increase employment from 50 to 100.
